

ACMPR - Frequently Asked Questions from Clients

1. First and foremost, what does this mean for Licensed Producers (LP)?

In addition to continuing to provide access to dried or fresh marijuana or cannabis oil, Licensed Producers will now also be the only legal source of starting materials (seeds or plants) and interim supply to individuals who are registered with Health Canada to produce or who have designated someone to produce for them, a limited amount of cannabis for their own medical purposes.

2. Will OrganiGram be supplying seeds or plants?

At this time, Organigram will not be supplying seeds or plants. Although this may change, we will mainly focus on a constant organic supply of dried cannabis and edible oils to our registered patients.

3. How can I apply to grow?

With the appropriate medical document from your health care practitioner, you can apply to register with Health Canada to produce cannabis for your own medical purposes or to designate someone to produce it for you.

4. How much can I grow?

For those who wish to grow with a registration certificate from Health Canada, patients are capped to their number of prescribed grams per day, using a plant equivalency ratio. It's easy to figure out how many plants Health Canada will enable you to grow: for every gram per day your doctor sets out on the medical document, you'll be able to grow 5 indoor or 2 outdoor plants. Therefore, an individual with a 3 gram per day license may grow up to 15 indoor plants.

5. Can you give me back my Medical document so I can apply to grow?

Unfortunately, as per ACMPR Prohibition - transfer of document, a licensed producer must not transfer to any person a medical document on the basis of which a client has already been registered.

6. Can I also purchase from a Licensed Producer?

Anyone with a valid registration certificate will be able to access Licensed Producer supply "in the interim" before they are able to harvest product. However, you must provide a copy of the registration certificate in order to register with ONE licensed producer -

We suggest to consider discussing with your physician to have 2 prescriptions; one to apply to grow and one to ensure continuous accessible supply to your medicine as application may be a lengthy one. It is

for you and your Physician to discuss what would be best for you.

7. What if I'm already registered?

You may continue to fill your prescription with us - you will however require to discuss to with your Physician to get a new prescription in order to apply to grow as Health Canada requires the original.

8. Can I now buy at storefront location?

Even if they advertise as "medical" and demonstrates a "clinic" feel, they are not legal - Legal cannabis can only be provided to a client via mail service from a designated Licensed Producer. These operations are illegally supplied and provide products that are unregulated and may be unsafe. Illegal storefront distribution and sale of cannabis in Canada are subject to law enforcement action. Your health is important to us - be safe!
